“Magento 1 has been and will continue to be supported for the foreseeable future”

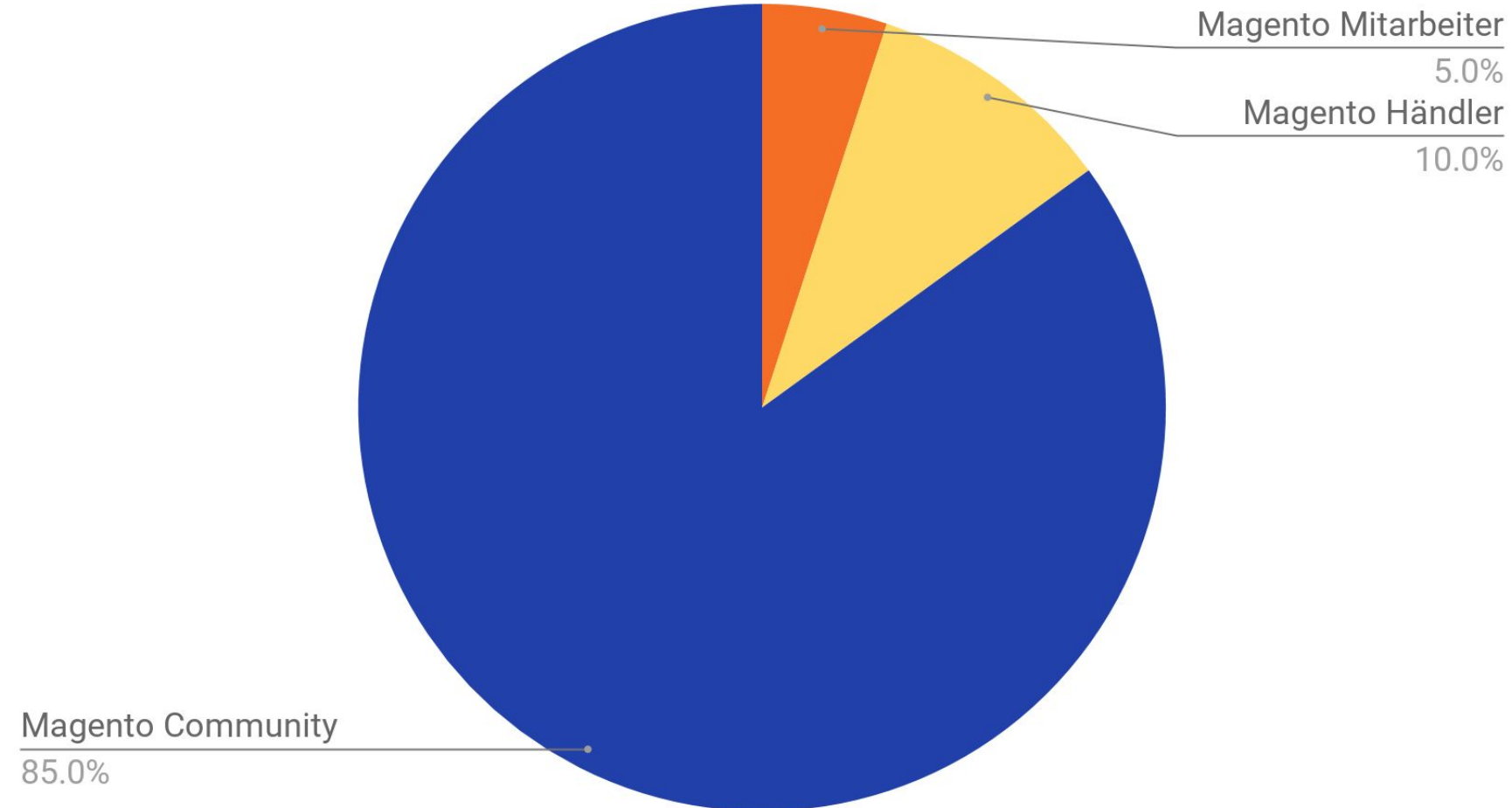

- announcement 18 months prior to EOL

What does an EOL mean for Magento 1.9?

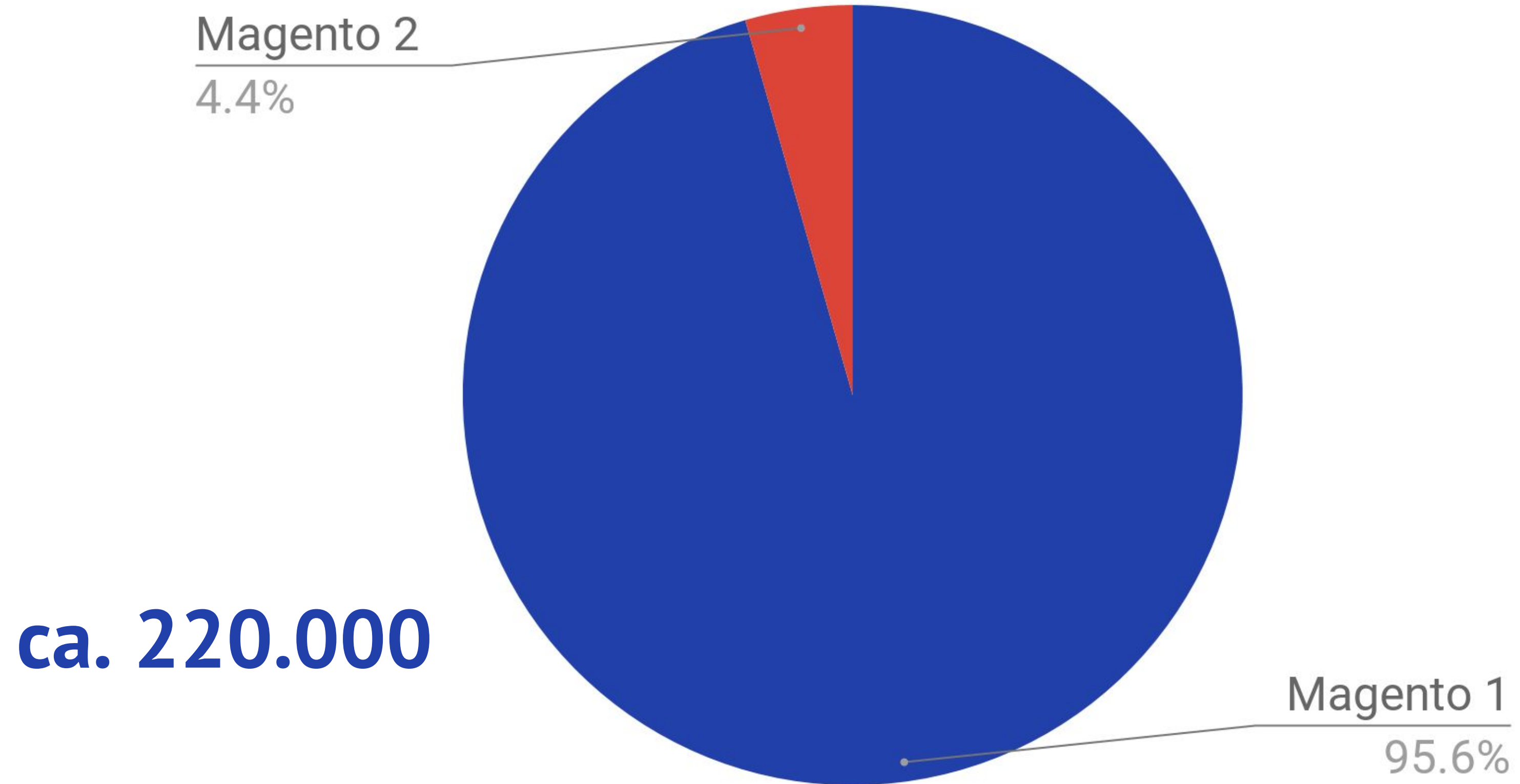
- System security and data protection as top priority
- Security patches should be installed immediately
- But: Even an official support end does not mean the end of Magento 1 shops

SUPEE-7405



- Patch fixes 20 security gaps
- 17 found & fixed by the community
- OpenMage / Magento Long Term Support

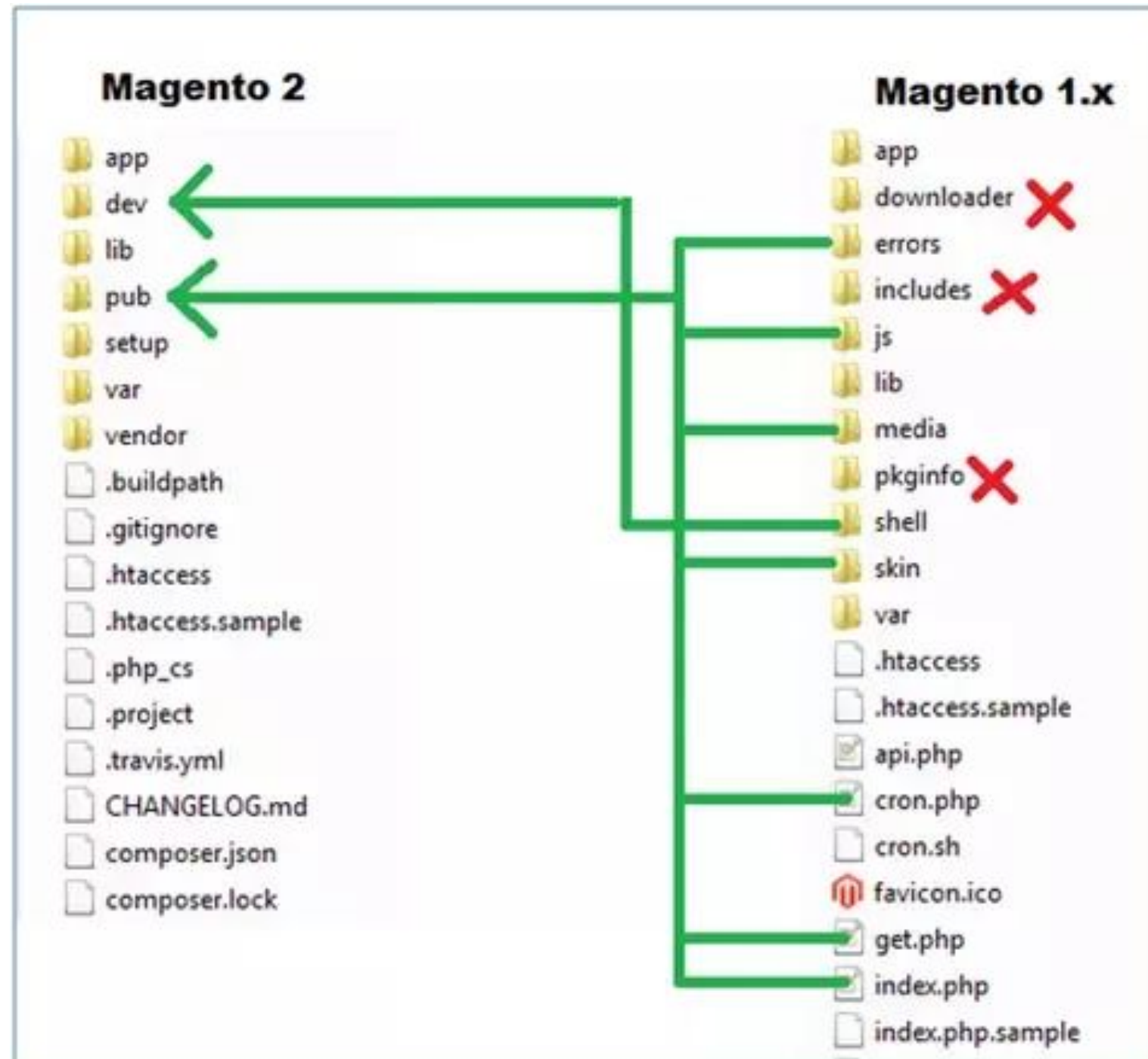


Update to Magento 2



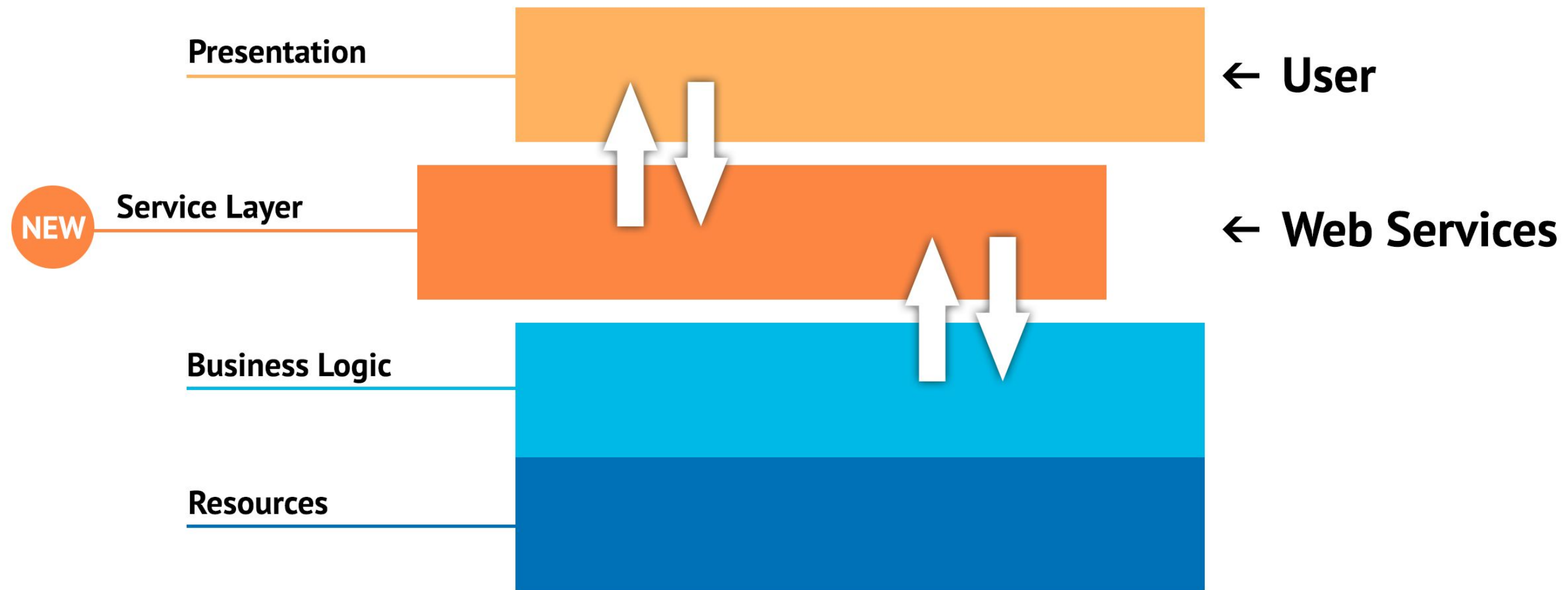
- No update, but platform change
- complete code structure significantly changed
- Migration of products / customers / ... possible
- Theme, extension, individual adjustments

Reworked code basis?



- Themes are handled completely differently
- None of the Magento 1.x extensions will work on the 2.0 platform without being developed from scratch.
- One code pool for core and custom modules
- No skin folder anymore: Assets are stored in the pub folder, template files directly in the module in the view folder

Magento 2 - yes or no?

- **There should be real added value behind the platform change**
- **Extensive process combined with a lot of manual work and costs**
- **Are all extensions I need available?**
- **Established processes must be renewed**
- **Innovation?**
